Scott Brooks: Presented two Flags. The Guilford Courthouse Flag also known as the North Carolina militia flag, is one of several early variations of the U.S. National flag. According to oral history, troops of North Carolina militia carried the flag at the battle of Guilford Courthouse on 15 March 1781 during the American Revolution. The flag features a unique configuration of stars and stripes, with an enlarged white canton displaying 13 blue, 8-pointed stars bordered by alternating red and blue stripes.

The second flag was the Sons of Liberty Flag. The flag was originally flown in Boston by the Sons of Liberty, a group of colonists resisting British efforts to take away their liberties. The flag had 9 vertical red and white stripes. The flag became known as the "Rebellious Stripes" and was not outlawed by the British, but the British did want to catch their leader's.

America 250 Presentation - Scott Brooks gave a short 5–10-minute talk about the Boston Massacre.

President Hull talked about James Madison who was born this day March 16<sup>th</sup>, 1751.

President Hull invited Craig Anderson up who spoke about the Spirit of America and the California State Meeting coming up in April.

President Hull Introduced Aaliyah Martinez & MSgt (USAF Ret) Ryan Peterson... SOA Youth Leadership Student. Alex thanked us for helping send her to Valley Forge. 


