President Hull: Gave a Thanksgiving Greetings to all the members. Mentioned that the first Thanksgiving was celebrated June 1676.

Scott Brooks: Presented Two Flags.

Betsy Ross Flag. The pattern of the Betsy Ross flag is 13 alternating stripes - 7 red, 6 white--with stars in a field of blue in the upper left corner. Its distinguishing feature is thirteen 5-pointed stars arranged in a circle to represent the 13 colonies that fought for their independence during the American Revolutionary War.

1st Pennsylvania Rifles Flag. The 1st Pennsylvania Rifles were raised in 1775. A tough outfit, their motto was "I refuse to be subjugated," in Latin Domari Nolo. Using the long rifle to deadly effect, they fought battles at Boston, Trenton, Princeton, Monmouth, Brandywine, Matson's Ford, Stony Point, Springfield, and Germantown. The 1st Pennsylvania wintered at Valley Forge with George Washington. Their flag flew at their camp.

President Hull called Craig Anderson / Jim Faulkinbury forward:

Craig and Jim talked about the 250th Anniversary of the American Revolution Recognition Program. The recognition program is designed to encourage and recognize those compatriots, chapters and societies that participate in local, state, national, and international events, which publically educate, and recognize, honor, and celebrate the events and heroes of the period surrounding the American Revolution.

President Hull had all Veterans stand for a round of applause and thank you for their service.

Happy Birthday! James Alvin Jolly

On November 2nd, Sacramento Chapter compatriot Dr. James Jolly celebrated his 100th birthday. His three children arranged a celebration party for him on November 6th that was attended by about 50 people. He sends his best wishes to all of the other veterans and his WWII Compatriots.

Jim is a life member of the Sons of the American Revolution; his application for membership was approved on November 7, 2002. His patriot ancestor, Samuel Calhoun, was a member of the committee to collect aid and relief for the people of Boston.

James was born on November 2, 1921, in Oceanside, California, and spent his childhood in the San Joaquin Valley where his family operated a dairy farm. He graduated from University of the Pacific with a degree in physics, and he earned his doctorate at the University of Santa Clara.

He was a Radio Officer in the Maritime Service from 1941 to 1946. During World War II he participated in both the European Theater of War and the Pacific Theater War. He was awarded the Merchant Marine Combat bar for service in the Aleutian Island campaign. Dr. James Jolly is an Emeritus Faculty of the California State University, Sacramento where he was a professor for 14 years before retiring.
