The speaker for our January 2014 meeting will be Col. James C. Crump, Jr. and his topic will be the Tuskegee Airmen, the African American Airmen who served with such distinction during World War II in North Africa and Europe. He will be accompanied by MSgt Judge Albert, Jr., one of few surviving Tuskegee Airmen.

Colonel Crump served on active duty in the Air Force with honor for more than 31 years. During his air force career he earned his Bachelor of Science in Mathematics from Alabama State University in 1962 and his Master in Business Administration from Golden Gate University of San Francisco in 1977. He served at numerous locations, both in the US and overseas. His last active duty assignment, from 1986-1988, was as the Inspector General for the Sacramento Air Logistics Center at McClellan Air Base.



Decorations and awards received include Legion of Merit, Defense Meritorious Service Medal, Meritorious Service Medal with 2 Oak Leaf Clusters, Joint Service Commendation Medal and Air Force Commendation Medal with 1 Oak Leaf Cluster.

After retiring from the Air Force, Colonel Crump served as the Chief of the Airport Firefighting and Airfield Operations Division for the Sacramento County Airport System retiring in February 2002. He is also a retired Sacramento County Reserve Lieutenant Deputy Sheriff. After serving ten years with the Sacramento County Sheriff Department, he retired in January 2004.

Colonel Crump has been affiliated with numerous professional and fraternal organizations. He is a life member of Tuskegee Airmen, Inc. and has served as Western Region president as well as Vice President (1999-2000) and President of the George S. "Spanky" Roberts Chapter here in Sacramento (2001-2009).

Wreaths Across America Sacramento Valley Nat'l. Cemetery Dixon, California, December 14, 2013

Dixon, California 14 December 2013

Once again, the Sacramento Chapter and the Gold County Chapter of the California Society Sons of the American Revolution participated as the Honor Guard in the Sacramento Valley National Cemetery "Wreaths Across America" ceremony in Dixon. The Sacramento Chapter, represented this year by President Russ Kaiser and members Vince Gantt and Steve Rainville, has participated as the Honor Guard in this ceremony since the Cemetery was first opened in 2005. During the last few years, guardsmen from the Gold Country Chapter have joined with the Sacramento Chapter to provide the Honor Guard. This year the Gold Country Chapter was represented by CASSAR Past President Keith Bigbee, CASSAR VP North Ron Barker, Chapter President Dale Ross, and members Bill Graber, Gordon Clark, and Barry Hopkins. The Honor Guard's role in the ceremony is for two Honor Guardsmen to escort two representatives from each of the six branches of the service, and the boy scouts representing the POWs and MIAs, to place wreaths on their service flags and return them to their seats. Two Honor Guardsmen then escort ladies from the Anne Loucks Chapter of the DAR, who have organized this ceremony each year, to lay a wreath for our patriot ancestors at the base of the National flag. It was a video of the 2006 ceremony in Dixon that resulted in the decision to make "Wreaths Across America" a National SAR event in 2008. The attendance at the ceremony this year was estimated to be over 3,000. This is one of the very few ceremonies in the nation in which a wreath is placed at every gravesite; this year over 10,500 wreaths. The remarks by dignitaries included CASSAR Exec. VP, Jim Faulkinbury, who read President General Joseph Dooley's proclamation.

Hal Lawson Obituary

William Harold Lawson

William Harold "Hal" Lawson passed away in the early morning hours on December 31, 2013. Hal was born on April 18, 1925, in Pomona, California, where he spent his childhood. As the son of a barber, he shined shoes as a youth to earn spending money. He graduated from the University of Redlands after WW II, majoring in Economics and Business Administration, and received his Masters in Political Science from UCLA in 1955.

He was a "dry land" sailor, Seaman 1st Class, and in 1945 was transferred to the NROTC-V-12 program at Oregon State as a Cadet-Midshipman before post-war demobilization. He worked at the U.S. Naval Ordinance Test Station at China Lake, CA, for Aerojet General, and for the State of California

The Lawson family moved to Lodi over 45 years ago, where he became an active member of Temple Baptist Church, and enjoyed serving Christ and watching Temple

Baptist grow since then. As a member of this community, he was also very active in Gideons International. For seventeen years he led weekly Bible studies at the Amador County Jail until his declining health prevented him from doing so. Hal's interests and activities included travel, the Gideons, church, a little golf, lots of family, genealogy, and serving as President of the River Oaks Home Owner's Association. He retired in 1990.

Hal's application to join the Sons of the American Revolution was approved on November 18, 2002. His patriot ancestor, Conrad Rightmyer, enlisted 23 July 1775, and served as a private in the Continental Line under Col. James Clinton in Elias Hasbrouck's Company. Hal also has several approved supplemental applications. He served as the Chaplain for the Sacramento Chapter in 2005, 2006, and 2007. Over the years Hal has encouraged almost all of his male relatives to join the SAR. They include his sons Robert and Douglas, grandsons lan and Luke, son-in-law George Taylor, uncle William Rightmyer, and nephew Scott Lawson.

Hal is survived by Ethel "Lee" Lawson, his wife of 63 years, four children: Ann Taylor of Pioneer, CA, Jeanne Lawson Mills of Portland, OR, Douglas Lawson of Lodi, and Robert Lawson of Lodi, sister Betty Lawson of Lodi (recently of Pomona, CA), and many grandchildren and great grandchildren.

A graveside service will held on Saturday, January 11, at 1 PM at Historic Lodi Memorial Cemetery on Pine St. in Lodi. A memorial service will be held on Saturday, January 11, at 2 PM at Temple Baptist Church in Lodi.

Note: Interment will occur 1:00 PM, prior to the memorial service that begins at 2:00 PM.
