

Los Californianos

The early Hispanic settlers of Alta California were called Californios or Californianos. The organization called Los Californianos was organized in 1968 by their descendants to preserve the Hispanic heritage of Alta California including history, music, culture and infrastructure and to help other descendants compile their Hispanic genealogy. The Spaniards began to settle in Alta California in the 1760's. By the 1770's Spain had begun to support the colonies in their struggle against Great Britain, so these members actively supported the American Revolution. Our member, Ernie Garcia, descends from these early settlers and is therefore a member of both Los Californianos and the SAR. On June 29 Los Californianos celebrated the 238th anniversary of the establishment of the Presidio in San Francisco by Captain Don Juan Bautista de Anza. The photos on this page are from that birthday celebration.
