President Hull Welcomed tonight's attendees.

Scott Brooks: Gave a great presentation on two Flags.

The first flag was the 1st Continental Regiment / 1st Pennsylvania Rifles Flag. The Regiment's flag is a deep green field with a crimson center square. In the square is a hunter with a spear, a lion in a snareand the regimental motto in Latin: "Domari Nolo", i.e., "I refuse to be subjugated".

The second flag was the Flag of Rhode of Rhode Island. Flown by the Rhode Islanders who fought in the American Revolution, this flag was an important part of the colony's history. The Flag consists of a White Flag of the Commonwealth with a banner, an anchor, and a star field. The Rhode Islanders were among the first to join the Minutemen outside of Boston. 3/4 of the regiment were Black soldiers.

President Hull: Made an announcement that the Chapter received a card & a \$1,000 gift donation from Tom & Marilyn Chilton plus a \$50 donation from a friend.

Craig Anderson made a Special Announcement. America will be celebrating the 250th anniversary of the ratification of the Declaration of Independence on July 4th 2026. Our mission for the next 4 years is to help educate the public on the sacrifices that our patriotic ancestors made to give us the freedoms we enjoy today. The America 250 SAR program awards points to SAR members and members of other organizations for presenting and attending these events.

Our chapter has two members who have qualified for the Bronze America 250 Medal. Jim Faulkinbury and Craig Anderson. Jim also qualified for the Silver Medal, which will be presented to him at the State Meeting in April.


