"Adam's patriot ancestor was Joseph Martin. Joseph Martin represented his area in the Virginia Legislature for years during and after the Revolution, and in 1777 then-Governor Patrick Henry named him Agent and Superintendent for Indian Affairs. He held that post until 1789, along with similar appointments from North Carolina and Georgia, making him the young nation's de facto Secretary of State for all of the Indian nations south of the Ohio River.


