Our keynote speaker for the Community Awards Banquet will be US Marshall Albert Najera, Eastern District of California. Albert Nájera was sworn in on October 28, 2010 to be the United States Marshal for the Eastern District of California. Albert Nájera rose through the ranks of the City of Sacramento Police Department to become the Chief of Police, a position he held from 2003 to 2008. He grew up in Sacramento, and has traveled around the world to lead anti-terrorist and emergency operations training sessions. He was also deployed to New Orleans in the aftermath of Hurricane Katrina to assist local law enforcement there. Mr. Nájera holds a Bachelors degree from California State University—Sacramento and a Masters degree from California Poly Pomona.

Two local law enforcement officers will be honored at this year's event. The representative from the CHP will be Officer Patrick Talley who will receive an award for actions he took when he encountered a fire in a home as he was passing by. He entered the home at his own great risk to investigate and rescue and prevent further spread of the fire.

The representative from the Sacramento Sheriff's Department will be Detective Kevin Warren who is being honored because of his leadership role during his years of service in the department during which he is described as being an outstanding resource in helping others in the department in managing complex cases and for his dogged determination in following up troubled individuals he comes across in the course of his duties.

- Special recognition was given to Jack Pefley as a member of the CA Society's California Company. The California Company is made up of compatriots who served during WW2. Minutes from September Meeting Continued

CASSAR Past President Jim Faulkinbury presented a historical overview of the Commander in Chiefs Guard Flag. This flag was for the Commander in Chief where a special Guard was put together with soldiers from each colony to protect George Washington's headquarters. They wore a special uniform that was similar to what George Washington wore. The second flag presented, the 11th Virginia Regiment Flag, was sometimes referred to as Morgan's Rifle Corps Flag because the Regiment was commanded by Daniel Morgan, cousin to Daniel Boone. Morgan's men had lighter, more accurate rifles and targeted British officers and artillery. Their success at the Battle of Cowpens was instrumental in bringing the war to a close at Yorktown.





CASSAR Past President Jim Faulkinbury presented a Certificate of Distinguished Service and Patriot Medal to Jeff Goodwin for his support and work with the SAR. He also presented to President Anderson a Certificate of Appreciation for our Color Guard's presentation of the Colors at the Daughters of the American Revolution Northern Council meeting.

President Anderson shared with our attendees that on July 29th Compatriot Vince Gantt passed away. Vince was a National Society SAR life member. He was approved for membership on May 5th, 2009. He was an active member of the Sacramento Chapter's Color Guard and an expert on Revolutionary War firearms. President Anderson called for a moment of Silence for Vince Gantt and struck 8 bells on the chapter bell in his honor.

President Anderson presented Carl Ahlberg a certificate indicating compatriot Ahlberg is now a member of the Vietnam War Veterans Corps and thanked him for his service.

President Anderson asked Alan Brooking to come forward to introduce new members Glenn Cline and Tom Jones. Compatriot Brooking introduced our new members, read their biographies and pinned the SAR Rosette on each. Our new members were asked to say a few words and then all members were asked to come forward to offer the customary welcoming handshake.

Dinner was served.

After dinner President Anderson introduced our speaker, Mindi Russell, a career Law Enforcement Chaplain. She manages four programs: Law Enforcement Chaplains Program, Community Chaplains Program, Outreach Chaplains Program, and the Office of Transportation Safety Program. She is the author of two books: !New Beginnings Journal" and co-author of !Chaplains Crisis Manual". In addition, she is a national disaster responder and works with first responders and victims. In April 2002, Chaplain Russell received the National Crime Victim Service Award from President George W. Bush and Attorney General John Ashcroft. This prestigious award is the highest federal honor for victim advocacy given by serving at Ground Zero on Sept 11, 2001.

Chaplin Russell shared stories about being at Ground Zero on 9-11 and her passion for serving law enforcement and schools. She is an ardent supporter of the Constitution and history, not wanting children to forget how America came to be. She shared how she is afraid children are not knowledgeable about important points of history. As someone who is called to help people right after a traumatic event she has been asked why so much bad stuff happens. She feels it all starts in the home or lack of home and we need families to be more like they were years ago. In 25 years she has never seen such hatred toward law enforcement or how there is such a lack of respect for parents, teachers and law enforcement.

Chaplin Russell shared that there are 87 schools in 16 districts that are begging for Chaplin support and help. Her organization helped with 4500 callouts last year, 24/7/365. They respond to 4-8 deaths a week, children in abusive situations and people who have attempted suicide. They are always looking for people who want to volunteer and encouraged our members to do so. Most chaplains are volunteers. Chaplains bring HOPE was her message. Chaplain Russell shared several heartwarming stories and was an inspiration to all who heard her. Past President Jeff Goodwin shared that after hearing Chaplin Russell speak in 2002 he was inspired to join the program.

President Anderson presented Chaplain Russell with a Certificate of Appreciation and a Liberty Bell.

President Anderson then thanked Alan Brooking, Don Clark and Eric Hanson for making calls inviting members to this meeting. He then conducted the raffle and thanked the following for bringing gifts for the raffle: Helen and Ernie Garcia, Sandy and Craig Anderson, Susan and Alan Brooking, Inga and Carl Ahlberg, Harlan and Sidney Ann Tougaw, Evan Jonas, Ron and Patty Proffer and Marilyn and Tom Chilton.

President Anderson thanked Mindi Russell for a great presentation, Susan Brooking for selling raffle tickets, Don Spradling for taking pictures and maintaining the flags, Alan Brooking for chairing the Calling Committee, acting as cashier and helping with the raffle and Neil Elvick for editing the newsletter.

A motion to adjourn was made and seconded. President Anderson led the Recessional, Jeff Goodwin gave the Benediction and Mindi Russell led the Chapter in singing "God Bless America." The meeting was adjourned at 8:53 PM.

James Jett - a Patriot of the American Revolution

James Jett, the son of Peter and Ann Jett, was born in about 1742 in King George County, Virginia, Peter and Ann had at least five children, including James. James' great-grandfather, Petter Jett, migrated to this county in about 1663, and was in Rappahannock County, VA, in 1664.

James, while still a young man, moved to Culpeper County, VA, where he married Roxena Duncan about 1761. James and Roxena had at least seven children. James Jett served as a Private in the 11th Continental Line.

After the war, James Jett and his family continued to live in Culpeper County, VA. In an obituary dated 1805 one finds that "James Jett died at his seat in Culpeper on Thursday last, after a short disposition, which bore him with much fortitude. He was 63 years old" "The family, friends, and acquaintances of this gentleman have experienced a loss which cannot be repaired, and his death will be regretted by all, as long as his many virtues are held in remembrance." In an inventory of his estate dated November 1805, was recorded that he had 820 pounds, and 220 acres of land.

James Jett is the patriot ancestor of Thomas Hobert Chilton, Jr., Thomas Holly Chilton, Ste-
