Anne Marie was elected Sacramento County's District Attorney in 2014. Since taking office in 2015, she has been committed to working both in the courtroom and in the community to provide the highest level of public safety through prosecution, prevention and innovation.

One of Anne Marie's passions is the pursuit of justice through DNA evidence and cold case prosecution. She formed the Cold Case Prosecution Unit in 2002, and served as its

nationally recognized in forensic DNA prosecution. She has taught extensively as well as published articles on forensic DNA and cold case prosecution. As Elected District Attorney, she has continued her passion for cold cases, leading the effort to use DNA to solve cold case murders and sexual assaults.

Anne Marie has also created innovative community programs focused on helping children by combatting truancy, and honoring citizens who have helped to serve justice with the development of the Annual Outstanding Citizen Awards Ceremony. During her career as a prosecutor, Anne Marie has been recognized by her peers with the Prosecutor of the Year Award and the POST ICI Instructor of the Year Award.


