

### September's Program

Sheriff John McGinness spent over 27 years with the Sheriff's Department before retiring in 2010. He is a highly decorated veteran with a background in many high profile assignments.

Sheriff McGinness served for many years as a member of the elite Sheriff's Motorcycle Detail, where he was a training officer and team leader. He also served as a CSI investigator, homicide detective and



department spokesman. Sheriff McGinness promoted through the ranks and ultimately commanded the Centralized Investigation Division until he was appointed Under-sheriff in March of 2001. He served as Under-sheriff until elected Sheriff in 2006.

Sheriff McGinness is an Adjunct Professor of Criminal Justice, Communications, Leadership and Professional Studies with California State University. After retiring, he accepted a position as host on Sacramento's top rated News Talk radio program broadcast on AM 1530, KFBK.

Sheriff McGinness holds a Bachelor of Arts Degree in Criminal Justice with a minor in Public Administration and a Master of Science Degree in Emergency Services Administration from California State University, Long Beach. He is also a graduate of the prestigious West Point Leadership Institute. He was appointed to the POST Commission by Governor Schwarzenegger in 2007.

Sheriff McGinness lives in Folsom with his wife, Peggy, and their two children.



# Notes From the 123rd National Congress Kansas City, Missouri July 6 -10, 2013

For those arriving on July 5<sup>th</sup>, an optional tour of the Steamboat Arabia Museum was available. The Arabia sank in 1856 loaded rich with goods. It quickly sank into the mud as the current ate the mud away around it taking it ever deeper. A few years later the course of the Missouri River changed slightly leaving the Arabia 65 feet below the surface of land for the next 132 years when it was finally rediscovered and restored into a museum.

Saturday July 6<sup>th</sup> included another optional tour of Kansas City and, in the evening, the Host Society Reception held in the National World War I Museum. The Museum was open for viewing of the exhibits during the reception, and held many artifacts from the Great War.

Sunday began the official activities of the Congress. I attended the Color Guard Breakfast with over 110 members of the National Color Guard attending the Congress. That was followed by a meeting of the Mexico Society where I was elected Secretary/Treasurer of MXSSAR. After lunch, the Color Guard formed for an inspection by President General, Stephen Leishman, and then marched to the Grace Holy Trinity Cathedral for the annual Memorial Service. Following dinner on our own, the finals of the Orations Contest were held. It was a real treat to listen to the six finalists give their entries.

The real business of the Congress began on Monday. I attended the Council of State Presidents Breakfast after which the Color Guard once again formed for the Presentation of the

Colors for the opening session of the Congress. The morning session heard the reports by the General Officers and Committee Chairmen. This was followed by the Youth Awards Luncheon where the National Society winners of the Eagle Scout, Knight Essay, Orations, and JROTC contest winners were recognized and received their prizes. The winner of the National Americanism Poster Contest was also named. CASSAR's entry from the Gold Country Chapter came in 2<sup>nd</sup> place. After lunch, the business session resumed with more reports, and then the debate and vote on proposed Bylaw changes. This year the delegates voted on 11 Bylaw changes. Most were

for things like membership and responsibilities on standing committees, how future Bylaw proposals could be submitted, or notifications using email rather than snail mail. One was a change in the investment policy for the various NSSAR funds to allow more flexibility in dealing with market changes. All but one of the 11 changes passed. The one that failed would have increased the fees for Supplemental applications from \$40 to \$80. I suspect we haven't heard the last of this proposal but at least until next year, the supplemental fees, as well as all other fees and dues, will remain the same. Another significant item was a visual presentation, by a company specializing in museum design, depicting the vision for what the NSSAR Museum could look like. After the presentation, the delegates moved to fund the initial stages of that vision. The Museum is projected to be completed for the opening of the 2015 Congress in Louisville. If you look at the home page on the NSSAR website, you can see video updates of the progress as the structure is nearing completion. After another dinner on our own, the Recognition Night ceremony was held. The six members of the Minuteman class of 2013 were recognized and presented with the Minuteman Medal after which the various State and Chapter Awards were presented. CASSAR received nineteen (19) Partners in Patriotism certificates for CASSAR and eighteen (18) chapters, eighteen (18) Liberty Medals/oak leaf clusters & certificates for members who were 1st line signers on 10 new member applications in 2012, two (2) Robert E. Burt Boy Scout Volunteer Awards, the Sen. Robert A. Taft Award for the State Society with the largest number of new members in 2012-2013, the Syracuse Award for State Society with the most new chapters in 2012-2013, the Eugene C. McGuire Award to State Society enrolling largest number of sons, grandsons, and nephews of SARs and DARs, and the C.A.R. Activity Award and streamer to State Society which has documented their work with the C.A.R. during 2012-2013.

Tuesday the 2<sup>nd</sup> session of the Congress resuming with a few revisions to some of the Bylaw changes for which language had been modified, and the nominations for the 2013-2014 General Officers were made. There was only one contested race - for Librarian General. The uncontested officers were unanimously elected. After lunch, I attended the meeting of the Council of State Presidents. This council is comprised of the current State Presidents, the immediate past State Presidents, and the anticipated next State Presidents. The primary purpose of the Council is to elect 4 members to serve on the NSSAR Nominating Committee that recommends next year's General Officer nominees. That meeting was followed by the balloting for the one contested race for Librarian General. In the evening, the Color Guard once again formed for the Presentation of the Colors at the President General's Banquet. A highlight of this banquet was the National Color Guard Change in Command ceremony.

Wednesday was the final session of the Congress. The declaration of election of the 2013-2014 General Officers was made followed by the election of the National Trustees. The Congress was adjourned and two optional tours were available for the attendees, a tour of the art museums of Kansas City or a tour to Independence, Missouri, to see the Truman Library, and the National Frontier Trails Museum at the trail head of the Santa Fe, Oregon, Mormon and California Trails. I chose the Independence tour. That evening, the Installation Banquet was held where the newly elected General Officers were sworn-in followed by remarks by President General Joseph W. Dooley. The Color Guard retired the Colors and the Congress was adjourned.




# Compatriot Trevor McCarthy Commissioned 2nd Lieutenant




